Academic Calendar

Term structure and tentative dates of academic year 2012/13 at Temple University

Fall 2012 semester starts (Mon.) Aug. 27, 2012

Spring 2013 semester starts (Tue) Jan. 22, 2013

Student should arrive one week to three days before beginning of semester.

Application to Temple University International Exchange Program

Fall deadline is March 15.

Spring deadline is October 15.

Qualifications for exchange students

Undergraduate students: full-time enrollment at home university for at least 2 academic years, GPA 3.00/4.00 or higher (80% or 3.5/4.5), TOEFL score of 79 IBT or IELTS score of 6.0.

Length of the study abroad exchange period at Temple

One (1) year or One (1) semester

Application package should include:

- Global Programs Application Form
- Nomination letter from Home University Office of International Affairs (or equivalent)
- Original sealed academic grade transcript
- Proof of English proficiency (official TOEFL or IELTS score)
- Personal study plan (list of courses approved by home institution to be completed at Temple University)
- I-20 application form (download at www.temple.edu/iss/documents/i-20_application.pdf)
- On-campus housing deposit of \$250 (if applicable)

Restricted Departments

Students are not able to select courses in the following departments:

Law

Performing Arts (Music or Theater)

Visual Arts (Film and Media Arts or Graphic Design)

Accommodations

Lodging (approximate): \$4,000-\$5,000/semester (rent + utilities)

Food cost: \$1,500/semester and up (depending on lifestyle)

Language Requirements

Official TOEFL (79 iBt, 550 paper-based, 213 computer-based) or IELTS (6.5) scores

Additional English language instruction may be required or offered through the Intensive English Language Program (www.temple.edu/ielp)

- Students will pay any late registration, schedule change, program, and/or course fees billed separately by the host department at Temple University.
- During the exchange semester, students will continue to pay full tuition and fees to their Home University.
